The Board approved its budget for 2021. This included the extra funding for the reading and writing programmes we approved in term 4 of 2020 which we updated you on in our final communications last year.

In other news:

Local Curriculum work continues to progress and there will be a hui between staff and the Board to present this work in more detail next term.

Communications – there are a number of ways the school is communicating with its school whānau now. These are:

- Taiari Times of Thames Principal David Brock blogs at the start of term and throughout the term if there are important messages such as school closures etc.
- Skool Loop app keep an eye on these for daily notices and weekly newsletters.
- Website <u>moana.school.nz</u> a fantastic new website that has up to date information. If there is anything you want to know about the school, use the easy navigational tool bars to find what you are looking for. If it's not there and you think it should be, just contact the school office.
- Moanataiari Sign Board keep an eye on the sign for relevant messages for the day/week as you drop off/pick up children.

• Parent Teacher Conferences – these are face to face meetings with the teacher so parents can find out how your child is doing and what support you can give at home. These will occur later in term 1 but in the meantime, if you have any concerns, just email your child's teacher. Email addresses are on the website at moana.school.nz.

Road safety – this continues to be a major concern for the Board. To keep our children safe, please follow the road rules by:

- Not stopping or parking on yellow lines. They are painted yellow for a reason which is to keep that area free of vehicles to allow for clear visibility for children crossing the road/walking into school.
- Not speeding around the perimeter of the school it is not a race track.
- Not cutting corners this is a real issue and has nearly resulted in a number of head on accidents.
- Being mindful that we have children crossing and running out in front of cars without sometimes stopping and looking first.
- Ensuring your child wears a helmet to and from school if they are riding a bike or a scooter.

Let's work together to keep our children safe.

Attendance – the more your children attend school, the more they learn which at this level provides the foundation for the future. Please avoid unjustified absences as this impacts their daily learning.

COVID-19 – we are now back in alert level 1. Parents and caregivers are welcome to come onto the school grounds in alert level 1. When entering the school, please sign in using the COVID tracer app at the school gate or office. Staff are prepared for any alert level changes. Please follow the government's rules for each alert level and keep our school whānau safe. Keep an eye out for important updates as alert levels change.
