
Lost Property Display





PhotoLife




Photos will be taken on Wednesday 4th August At 9am, Moanataiari School

This year you can VIEW and PURCHASE photos Online.

How does it work?

- 1. Every child will be photographed individually AND/OR in their Class group AND/OR in their team photo.
- 2. When photos are ready for printing students will bring home their own unique shoot key.
- 3. Simply follow the Steps to VIEW and PURCHASE your photos.
- 4. Order is completed and payment is made Online.



Advantages

You can ONLY view your own child(rens) photos.

Orders that are placed within the 3 week time frame <u>are delivered to school</u> and DO NOT incur a Postage and Packaging charge.

Orders can be placed anytime after the 3 week time frame and are posted directly to families.

FAQ's about PhotoLife's Online Ordering System

1. When will my child's photo be Online to view?

As soon as the photos have been checked and uploaded to the Internet, the Shoot Key's for the students will be delivered to school for your child to bring home (approx 2 weeks after Photo Day).

2. Can anyone else see my child's photo Online?

No. Your unique 8 Digit Shoot Key will only display your own child's photos.

3. I don't have access to a computer OR I don't want to purchase Online.

PhotoLife will supply a number of Order Envelopes along with the Shoot Keys to your school office to give to any student's whose families do not have access to the internet or who do not wish to use the Online Ordering system. You just need to pick up an Order Envelope from the School Office.

4. How can I make sure I get the FREE DELIVERY offer?

PhotoLife gives a "free delivery" period of 3 weeks from the date the Shoot Keys are dispatched to the school for parents to place their orders. It is best to go online straight away and place your order.

The expiry date of the "free delivery" period is clearly shown on the website and automatically expires when that date is reached.

5. What happens once the "free delivery" period expires?

PhotoLife will dispatch the photo orders directly to the home address (as typed in by the person placing the order). A \$6.00 postage charge will be automatically added.

6. How can I get a Sibling Photo of my children together?

You will need to pick up a Sibling Photo booking Form from the School Office **<u>BEFORE</u>** Photo Day.

Please fill out and return the form so that your children can be photographed together. You will then receive a special Shoot Key for the Sibling Photo and be able to view and order your Sibling Photo Pack online.

Health and physical education - Implementation plan

School organisation:

Health and PE leadership: will attract a management unit with a curriculum focus

Professional development: This is pending school-wide for Pause, Breathe, Smile. Teachers:

- a. (Y1-6) must know how to take instructional swimming.
- b. (Y4-8) must know how to safely run Outdoor Educational experiences

Other development for staff including purchase of texts or courses will need to be planned for and agreed to by the principal in the teacher's professional growth plan. He Māpuna te Tamaiti self-assessment tool. St Johns | Red cross training (selected staff). NZ swimming

Planning: Education outside the classroom experiences must be sighted by the team leader and principal prior to the experience taking place. All volunteers for EOTC events are police vetted.

Programme allocation: It is expected that fitness occurs every day and that children are systematically taught relevant physical skills. Pro-social skills and well-being skills are explicitly taught. Classes will annually experience learning outside the classroom.
