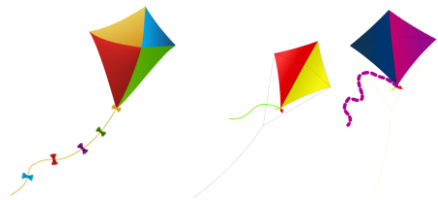
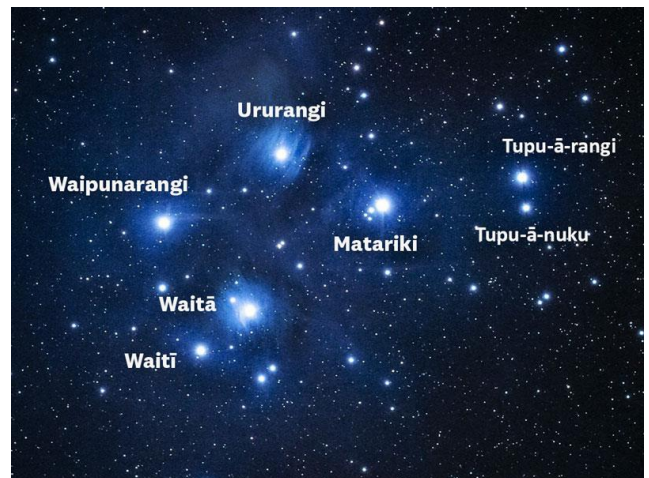
Gymfest

Junior Syndicate – Get Firewise

Our junior team are working on a Get Firewise unit over the next two weeks. The students will learn some fire-safe behaviours. They will practice what to do to get out **FAST** if there is a fire in a building they are in.

Each year Fire and Emergency NZ attends about 5,000 house fires. Around a quarter of house fires start in the kitchen from unattended cooking. Once a fire has started in a room people have **three minutes** to get out of the room before they breathe in poisonous smoke and die.

Here are three things you can do to get out quickly and safely if a fire occurs in your home:

1. Install working smoke alarms in lounges and family living areas, halls and bedrooms to alert you to the fire. If you are asleep you cannot smell smoke.
2. Have an escape plan so that every family member knows two ways to get out of every room and knows where to go to a safe meeting place.
3. Practise getting out of every room **FAST** when the smoke alarm goes off or if someone shouts **FIRE**.

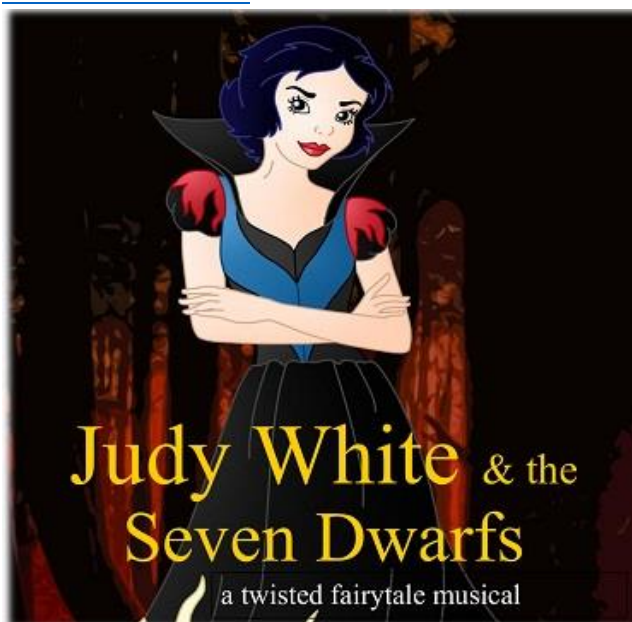
AUDITIONS
