BOARD OF TRUSTEES UPDATE JUNE 2022

Kia ora koutou,

We hope everyone had a nice long weekend in honour of the Queen's birthday and the 70th anniversary of the Queen's reign. What an amazing achievement.

Firstly, the Board of Trustees (the Board) acknowledge and thank staff and students for adapting their everyday teaching and learning to accommodate changes needed to cover absenteeism to ensure teaching continues for our students during these challenging COVID times. We acknowledge it is a difficult time for everyone but together we are getting through this with plenty of manaakitanga – caring, manawaroa – grit and determination, and whakaute – respect for each other.

At the end of term 2, Siobhan Flanigan left the Moanataiari School Board after many years of service to the school both as a board member and as the Board Chair.

Student Voice Report

At its May meeting, the Board received the results of a student voice survey entitled 'promoting a culture of well-being and learning 2022' undertaken by 60 students that sought input from years 4-8. This aligns with the strategic goal 1 - student engagement on the Board's work plan. Overall, the results were positive with students saying learning at Moanataiari school was fun, with particular interest in Maths, Art, Writers Toolbox and wanting more school educational trips.

Staff will discuss the results further and look at ways to improve learning opportunities at Moanataiari School.

The Board is also exploring the opportunity of having a student voice representative involved with the Board. As already advised and for your information, the three strategic goals focused on for 2022 are as follows:

- 1. Student engagement;
- 2. Giving effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi; and
- 3. To raise writing levels of achievement.

Speaking of School Trips

Well done to year 6 class who recently visited and walked the Blue Springs Trail in Putaruru as part of their Waihou River studies. It was a fabulous educational day out for both students and whānau who attended. Students were then asked to make a brochure that included 5 main facts, photos and a description on how the walking trail is maintained. They did such an awesome job Ms Trenwith sent the brochures to the South Waikato District Council. Year 6 were delighted to receive a letter of thanks from Mayor Jenny Shattock QSM who was extremely impressed with the brochures and thought there could be some future South Waikato District Council Parks and Reserves staff in the making.

Fundraising Group

A new fundraising group has been formed after a successful fundraising meeting was held early in term 2 inviting people to attend with their fundraising ideas. It was a positive meeting with some awesome ideas raised.

The top three fundraising priorities which will benefit the students directly are:

- New junior playground;
- School van to transport children to inter school events and activities;
- Local curriculum educational school trips.

Moanataiari School can and will apply for funding where we can, however, any money that can be fundraised ourselves and used as leverage against any funding application sought will be considered favourably by funding boards.

- Managing assets;
- Ensuring the school's legal compliance;
- Implementing the National Education Guidelines.

The Board is responsible for showing leadership and taking a strategic view of its work programme, monitoring progress and reporting back on performance and engaging the community as needed.
