Garden Newsletter Term 1 2021

Hello Everyone,

Welcome back to the garden for another fun and busy year. We have had a very hot, dry summer and our garden beds are feeling the heat.

At the end of last year, we planted pumpkins, squash, and watermelons. With the help of some watering, these will soon be ready to harvest. A group of students in room 6 has already begun researching delicious pumpkin recipes, yum!





While we are waiting for our pumpkins to finish growing we are working in other spaces in the garden. We have begun clearing the weeds and grass from under the fruit trees, so that we can plant some flowers for our pollinators. We have also been busy clearing the

summer grass growth away from the little trees in the Native Tree Garden. Some of our trees and flaxes have not survived through the summer, we will look at replacing these with

more of the hardy varieties that have survived the conditions.





Summer is a great time to observe the abundance of insect life in the garden.

Students have been enjoying exploring the environment with magnifying glasses, finding and identifying many different bugs. Budding scientists!



Our rainwater collection tanks have been delivered, we are just waiting on the plumbing pipes to connect them up. Very soon they will be in place and ready for use, a fantastic

asset for the garden. The funding also stretched to some new watering cans to help us deliver the rainwater from the tanks to our plants in the garden.



Another new addition to our garden is a sundial, classes have been looking at how it works and thinking about compass directions. Room 9 has a weather station that they are looking to set up in the garden, this includes a weather vane that will help us learn about the direction of our prevailing winds. We will also be able to measure rainfall with the rain gauge.





Room 6 has begun planning some individual projects in the garden. The students are taking on responsibility for looking after garden beds around the school grounds and also various pots and tyres with plants in them. One group is looking at revamping the little pond by the guava tree in the quadrangle area. Thanks room 6, you will help our school look even more beautiful! Here are some "before" pictures. We can't wait to see what you do room 6.





This week is Seaweek - Kaupapa Moana from 6 to 14 March. Seaweek is New Zealand's annual national week celebrating the sea, hosted by the NZ Association for Environmental Education (NZAEE). This year the Seaweek theme is Connecting With Our Seas - Toi Moana, Toi Tangata. In the garden, we will be looking at how the coastal environment is different from an inland environment when it comes to plants. We will also be exploring how the sea helps our garden, for example with the use of seaweed and fertilizers made with products from the sea.

So much to look forward to in the garden in the coming term, and remember extra help from volunteers is always welcome in our garden - when alert levels allow!
