Kia ora Moanataiari Whānau

In this update, we share a summary of our October and November Board meetings.

NEW POLICIES ADOPTED

School Uniform Policy

The Board has approved a refreshed Uniform Policy that supports pride, unity, safety, inclusion, and student well-being.

Key points:

- Correct uniform is expected daily unless the principal grants an exemption.
- Approved items include jade/marine polo shirts with logo and navy shorts, pants, or skorts.
- Sunhats required in Terms 1 & 4.
- Jewellery limited to small plain studs/sleeper earrings, a watch (non-smart), and taonga or cultural/religious jewellery with principal approval.
- Temporary exemptions may be available for financial, medical, cultural, or religious needs.

Attendance Policy

A new Attendance Policy has been adopted and will come into effect on 27 January 2026. This strengthens expectations for regular, punctual attendance and aligns with national requirements.

Key parts of the policy:

• Caregivers must notify the school on the day of absence, before 9:15 am.

- Medical certificates required for prolonged or frequent illness.
- Attendance recorded daily; unexplained absences trigger same-day contact.
- Parents/Caregivers to ensure their contact details are always current and up to date.

★ STAR - Stepped Attendance Response

The Ministry of Education's STAR model guides how schools respond when attendance begins to decline:

Stage A – Early Signs

Informal support to resolve minor or early absences.

Stage B - Moderate Concerns

Formal meeting and an Attendance Support Plan.

Stage C - Severe or Ongoing Absence

Referral to Attendance Services and potential Ministry escalation.


OUR COMMITMENT TO TE TIRITI O WAITANGI
