## **Uniform Reminder**

All students must wear our correct school uniform during school hours. Our uniform consists of:

**School polo shirt** with school logo **Plain navy** shorts/skorts/pants (<u>not black or</u> denim)

**Plain navy** sweatshirt or navy polar fleece with school logo

**Navy** bucket hat/navy wide brim hat

**Shoes**: covered, flat/practical that child is free

to run and walk in (no heels)

Hair: long hair must be tied up for protection

against nits

Jewellery: watches, stud/sleeper earrings only.

(If a student has taonga that they wish to wear at school, a letter must be written to the

principal for approval first.)

No makeup or long nails are to be worn at school.

Please put your child's name on ALL ITEMS OF CLOTHING. In the swimming season all clothing, togs and towels should be named and swimming gear brought to school in a water-proof bag.

If students are not able to wear uniform, for whatever reason, a note to the class teacher explaining is required. On-going non-compliance with uniform is considered to be a discipline issue. Second-hand uniform is available from Room 8 for a gold coin donation.

## **Moanataiari After-School Care**

#### **Sun Hats**

## **Absence From School**

Absence from school will become increasingly difficult in 2025/26 for two reasons.

- 1) Hon David Seymour has announced a Stepped Attendance Response (STAR) See details below
- 2) The new learning curriculum is academically demanding, and if your child is away, there will be pressure to keep up with the curriculum. Please be aware of the changes and government regulations. Parents will not be able to take holidays during term time with their children. Due to this, our school can't condone holidays during the term.

## **Stepped Attendance Response (STAR)**

The Government's target is that 80 per cent of students will be present for 90 per cent of the term by 2030.

On 26 September, the Associate Minister for Education, Hon David Seymour, announced a Stepped Attendance Response (STAR). The STAR guides schools and communities to address every absence early.

"It will be mandatory for all schools to have an attendance management plan based on STAR from the beginning of the 2026 school year. The Ministry will work with schools, the Attendance Service, non-government agencies and other government agencies to streamline this. The Ministry will also provide best practice templates for attendance plans and toolkits for dealing with absent students, depending on the reasons for absence.

## Student Uniform

Moanataiari School requires our students to wear a school uniform. This policy and the associated uniform rules are a \* school bylaw. The board consults with the school community when updating this policy and making or amending uniform rules.

Our uniform rules outline what students can and cannot wear at school and while representing the school. These rules are made clear to students and their parents/caregivers at enrolment. We follow school processes for managing breaches of uniform rules, which may include contacting parents/caregivers and involving senior staff. If uniform breaches are due to financial hardship, our school works with parents/caregivers to find a solution.

Students may be reminded about appropriate dress expectations for the school learning environment before non-uniform days.

Students must behave appropriately while in uniform (e.g. at school, at events representing the school, and travelling to and from school).

The board may review our uniform rules when issues arise, and/or as part of the review of this Student Uniform policy. When reviewing our uniform, we consult with the school community and consider student wellbeing (including sun protection), affordability, our inclusive education policy, and the New Zealand Human Rights Commission • uniform guidelines.
