Compost Project

Our Seagull Centre-funded compost project is nearly up and running. This includes expanding our current composting system, to create more compost for use in our school garden and help divert food waste from going to landfill in our community.

We have 5-litre containers that families will take home and keep until it is full of food scraps. Then the full containers are dropped back at school so we can compost the waste. The full container is swapped for a clean, empty container to take home and refill again. Students will be able to do this themselves. We will have a small shed where our school whānau can drop off their container and collect their clean one.

It will create an opportunity for whānau to engage in our sustainable living practice.

Liquid paperboard cartons, such as soy milk cartons, UHT milk, etc will soon be able to be recycled into building board products.

The cartons MUST be cut open to lie flat, washed clean and dried thoroughly before being left at our school office. Carton caps can be left screwed onto the carton.
