Curriculum and Attendance Updates

This year, we will be implementing Ministry of Education changes in **English and Mathematics** to ensure our students receive high-quality, evidence-based instruction that supports their learning and progress. More details will be shared as we integrate these changes into our curriculum.

As a staff we have already had a day of professional development with Sandy Haddock of Pr1me Mathematics. We are in a good position because we began working with Pr1me several years ago. Now we are being introduced to the changes, updates and digital platform.

Additionally, we are continuing with the **Mitey initiative**, which focuses on enhancing our students' well-being and mental health through structured, engaging learning experiences. This initiative is designed to foster resilience and emotional intelligence in our tamariki.

Importance of Attendance

Regular attendance is crucial for student success, as it provides consistency in learning, social development, and overall academic achievement. When children attend school every day, they build strong foundations in literacy and numeracy, develop positive relationships with peers and teachers, and gain the skills needed for future success. Absenteeism can disrupt learning, making it harder for students to catch up and stay engaged.

The government is now taking a **more proactive approach to monitoring school attendance**, including the collection of real-time attendance data. This initiative aims to support schools and families in addressing absenteeism early and ensuring that all children have the best opportunities to learn and thrive. We encourage all whānau to prioritise school attendance and reach out if support is needed to ensure students can be present and engaged in their learning.
