

Leavers Dinner Meeting

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Rooms 6 and 7 had a wonderful time on their senior camp and here are a few recounts:

Waitawheta Camp

Nearly arriving at our destination, we went past a bridge, which was over a river that we were going to kayak in. Arriving at Waimarino, we parked and went inside to see the awesome waterpark. The first thing we saw was the hydro slide which was straight, fast and ferocious. We ate a little bit and went kayaking. The instructor, Royce, taught us how to kayak and off we went. Our first task was to make a raft which basically linked our kayaks together without hands, and there were 3 rules: 1, don't let go 2, don't let go and 3, never let go.

Afterward, we did 3 missions. 1 was to capsize and get back up again with a T and an X formation. After that we did the low rider, high rider, and standing up on our kayak seat. I had a lot of experience from the high rider since it's like pumping on a surfboard so that was fun. When we finished we made another raft and played another game called Evolution.

You go from an egg to a chicken, to dog, to a horse, to a t-rex, and finally to a water-breathing dragon. Your goal is to be a water-breathing dragon and it's the only animal in the game with a special power, the ability to splash people. We finished kayaking and did all the other activities, but kayaking was the best.
